Summary of Activities

COMMUNICATION & EDUCATION

Education

Town halls, Evidence Academy, Learn & Share, and Community Conversations webinars; videos, Professional development for primary care providers with NC Area Health Education Center Program; mini-grant outreach events reached 44,750 individuals

Developed children's coloring book in collaboration with local author and illustrator to engage and inform families about COVID-19 and teach children about vaccinations

Spanish language translations and an expansion of language access to reach a more diverse group

Virtual/social media

Social media campaigns using centrally housed digital messages delivered by partners; webinars

Culturally appropriate digital learning aids such as animations and fotonovelas

Generated 120 social/traditional media posts reaching ≈20,000 community members
